Pastor's Corner

My brothers and sisters,

Last week I introduced a new sermon series called *The Lord of your everyday life*. I will be preaching sermons about our Lord's relation to our everyday realities such as family life, work, our thought life, our bodies, our money and stuff, our people encounters, our trials, our futures, etc. We will be doing this for eight or ten weeks to start the New Year. Today's sermon is about our everyday devotional life. I am going to be talking about prayer and reading God's word.

In a church this size, I'm quite sure different people are in different places in their devotional lives. Some of you experience joy and peace in praying and reading God's word daily. You look forward to it. It is a rich time. Others may be more hit and miss right now. Life is busy and it's not been a priority. For some, devotional life is frustrating. You find it hard to really connect with God and get something meaningful out of it. Maybe you are in a desert time, and you feel spiritually dry. Still others just haven't been taught to pray and read God's word daily. It's a new idea to you.

Wherever you are, I encourage you to seek God through daily prayer and bible reading this year. If you are not doing it, start with giving it 15 minutes a day in a quiet place. Read one chapter of Scripture (start with the gospel of Mark or John, then try Acts, then Romans, then Genesis, then Psalms, then Proverbs) each day and pray about what you read. Ask God to help you understand it. Ask him to help you get to know him and his story better. Ask him to help you live out anything that is applicable to your life.

And then just pray to God about what is on your heart. Pray about what you are going through in life. Pray about what you are facing. Pray for others. Some find it helpful to pray according to the acronym ACTS. "A" is for prayers of adoration (praise God for his greatness). "C" is for prayers of confession of personal sin. "T' is for prayers of thanksgiving. "S" is for prayers of supplication (requests of God).

I know this: God wants to have a real relationship with each of us. He wants you to know him better and grow closer. Ultimately, he seeks to make you more like Jesus as you grow in relationship with him.
