Today, I want to share with you a prayer that I have been praying for years. I find it helpful to my spiritual life and my posture toward God – one of submission to him no matter what. The prayer was written by Charles de Foucauld, a 19th century French Christian, who lived a life of simplicity among the poor. Part of the prayer is similar to the final words of Jesus on the cross. It is called *The Prayer of Abandonment:*

> Father. I abandon myself into your hands: do with me what you will. Whatever you may do, I thank you; I am ready for all, I accept all.

Let only your will be done in me, and in all of your creatures, I wish no more than this, O Lord.

Into your hands I commend my soul; I offer it to you with all the love of my heart, for I love you Lord and so need to give myself, to surrender myself into your hands, without reserve. and with boundless confidence. For you are my Father.

If you think this prayer could be helpful to you, go ahead and use it during your private prayers. And feel free to share it. I love the surrender in the prayer and the phrase "boundless confidence."
